Hope you have fun and once again, my heartfelt thanks for supporting our efforts to create a no-kill world.



GENERAL WALK INFORMATION

30-MILE FACEBOOK WALK CHALLENGE SUGGESTIONS

- Walk with your friends, family, colleagues, and your furry best friend on a trail, in a park, or around your office building. Virtual walkers will receive a branded bandana while supplies last with their first donation. You also qualify for exciting Walk & Wag fundraising contests and prizes.
- Form a team: Enlist four or more people to register with you. That way you can spend time with your friends, family, and colleagues all while raising even more important, lifesaving funds.
- Communicate: Encourage and engage your team members with emails and/or group texts.
- Hydrate: Make sure you have plenty of water on hand for both dogs and human walkers.
- Submit your fundraising: The deadline is October 7 to qualify for contests and prizes. Be sure to check your email leading up to the walk for more information. (Prizes to be distributed in October.)

TIPS FOR SUCCESSFUL ONLINE FUNDRAISING

- Use social media to expand your engagement. Share stories about the special animals in your life and why raising funds for North Shore Animal League America's no-kill mission is so important to you.
- Use photos for online fundraising tools images are a great way to attract interest.

EFFECTIVE FUNDRAISING IDEAS

- Ask for donations in person people are much more likely to give if you ask them face-to-face, rather than via email or letter.
- Ask your company to set up a "lunch and learn" to recruit employees for the Walk.
- Ask your friends to contribute to your fundraising page in lieu of gifts for a special occasion.
- Ask your local restaurants or frequently visited stores if they will donate a percentage of the day's earnings to your goal.
- Hold a pet party invite your friends to bring their dogs over for a fun day filled with games for your pups. Makes a great time to ask for donations!
- See if your company has a matching gift program. Many companies will match a gift when an employee makes a donation. Matching gifts can double or triple the impact in fundraising totals!
- Print out a copy of the "Why I Walk & Wag" sign and proudly display it in your front window or on your door. You can also take a photo with it and post it on social media using the hashtag #walkandwag2023 and tag @animalleague

PET FIRST AID **ESSENTIALS**

Most people have first aid kits in their home, office, and cars for themselves and their family members, but not every pet owner has an essential first aid kit for their pets. We'd like to help you assemble your own pet first aid kit so that you can be ready if an emergency occurs.

KEEP AN EMERGENCY PET SUPPLY AND FIRST AID KIT ON HAND AT ALL TIMES

 □ A basic pet first aid book □ Waterproof carrying case for paperwork and supplies □ A sturdy carrier large enough for your pet to stand and turnaround You want to transport your pet safely and securely □ A supply of your pet's current prescriptions such as heartworm and flea/tick medication packed in waterproof containers clearly labeled with pet's name □ Prescription medications with dosing □ Photocopies of your pet's paperwork: Important medical records, vaccinations, microchip number, etc. □ Copies of current veterinary history including medical conditions and vaccination information □ Emergency contact numbers for alternative caretakers should you become incapacitated or unable to care 	 □ Phone numbers and addresses of your veterinarian, emergency animal hospital, a local animal shelter/humane society, or boarding kennels and pet-friendly motels/hotels, poison control center □ At least one week's supply of food and water, including bowls and a manual can opener □ Bags to pick up after your dog; cat litter and disposable litter box for your cat □ Cleaning supplies: Paper towels, newspapers, disinfectant □ A mild antibacterial soap: To clean skin and wounds □ Alcohol prep pads: To sterilize equipment — DO NOT use on wounds □ Cotton swabs □ Self-adhesive bandages: Flexible bandages used to wrap and stabilize injuries (do not wrap too tightly) 	 □ Triple antibiotic ointment: For cuts and abrasions (never for eyes) □ Hydrogen peroxide: For cleaning minor cuts and abrasions □ Medical gloves: To protect hands and prevent contamination □ Scissors: To cut gauze or the animal's hair if necessary □ Tweezers: For the removal of foreign objects from skin and paws □ Adjustable muzzle: • In case your pet is injured or frightened and needs to be handled by rescue workers or a veterinarian and frequency • To safely attend to wounds without the risk of being bitter
